Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix

he Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix represents more than a motorsports event. It's also an opportunity to give back to the community. On February

19, during the Pittsburgh Auto Show, grand prix organizers presented a check for \$340,000 to its charities, the Autism Society of Pittsburgh and Merakey
