

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

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

OUR CHARITY PARTNERS

Since our founding in 1983, the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix Association's mission has remained the same: to produce a world-class vintage racing event to raise funds to support individuals with autism and intellectual/developmental disabilities. Last year we raised \$350,000, bringing our 42-year donation to more than \$7 million for Autism Pittsburgh and Merakey Allegheny Valley School.

The PVGP Ambassador Program reflects the lives touched by our mission. Over the years, individuals supported by our charities have become familiar faces at PVGP events-mingling with guests, sharing stories, and embodying our cause.

Each ambassador reminds us of the real impact our event and charity partners have. Through the educational and residential programs offered, thousands of lives have been transformed. Our ambassadors put a human face to this work, showing that public support creates meaningful, lasting change.

Autism-Pittsburgh addresses the needs of individuals with autism in 14 counties in Western Pennsylvania through a comprehensive array of information, advocacy and referral services, provided to their families and the caring professionals and service providers who work with them. This includes creating, developing and improving programs and approaches in diagnosis, treatment, education, training and social adjustment.

Autism is a neurological disorder that impairs behavior and communication; often tragically. More than 42,000 families in Western Pennsylvania have individuals with this disability: over 18,000 alone in Allegheny County. The CDC indicated a national rate of 1 in 44 births are children with autism. Their families are often overwhelmed by the enormous task of discerning and providing for their complex needs.



Merakey Allegheny Valley School (AVS) provides compassionate care to support more than 600 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across Pennsylvania. Over the years, contributions from the PVGP have funded hundreds of initiatives at various locations, significantly improving the lives of the individuals, their families, and dedicated staff. These donations have enabled Merakey AVS to upgrade facilities and to enhance programs throughout Western PA. This year, PVGP funding supported the installation of a new pool lift, ensuring safer and more comfortable access to the therapeutic sensory pool. It also made possible the


addition of fire-safe doors in the Memory Care Home, improvements to outdoor areas, a new security system, and several other key facility upgrades.

While Medicaid covers essential operational costs such as housing, food, medications, utilities, and staffing - it does not fund critical needs like equipment, renovations, or program expansion. Donations from individuals, foundations, corporations, and organizations like the PVGP are vital to bridging this gap. These investments enhance daily living for those served, and also promotes greater independence and accessibility.



RAMSEY POTTS

Returns Home to Serve as the Grand Marshal of the 2025 PVGP




Ramsey Potts, founding partner of Broad Arrow Auctions, is making the journey north to serve as the 2025 Grand Marshal for the 43rd annual Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix during the July 19/20 Race Weekend in Schenley Park. With his mother hailing from Oakmont, father from Ligonier, and being one of eight relatives to graduate from the University of Pittsburgh, it's a return to a city that has played a pivotal role in his life. Attending his first PVGP in 1987 and being present for many since, Ramsey is honored to play a role in one of the most unique automotive events in North America.

"I do not have words to express my gratitude to serve as the Grand Marshal. I firmly believe the PVGP is wholly unique and one of the most significant collector car events in the country - it is, as we say in the collector car auction world, an unrepeatable opportunity!" In Ramsey's global travels to work with car collectors he can be heard extolling the virtues of what he believes are the three most important collector car events in US: The Amelia Concours, Pebble Beach Car Week, and the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix. "I usually receive a guizzical expression when I mention the PVGP, and that's my opening to tell the story of an event unlike any other in America, where committed volunteers present 10 days of collector car gatherings and vintage racing on the streets of a city that is at its very best every July."

Ramsey will also be participating in the Panther Hollow Hillclimb in his 1987 Porsche 944 Firehawk race car. "I can race under no safer and more attentive eyes than the countless volunteers who watch over the Schenley Park circuit and freely give so much of their time to bring the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix to life!" "I can't think of a more fitting person to serve as our Grand Marshal than Ramsey Potts," exclaimed PVGP Executive Director Dan DelBianco. "He has been an ambassador for our event for decades, speaking about the PVGP with such eloquence and conviction-it's amazing. We are thrilled that he is bringing his Porsche to town to kick off the inaugural hill climb."



Ramsey's automotive-related career began following high school, when he attended Vale Automotive Technology Institute in Blairsville, Pennsylvania, earning his ASE Technician status before moving on to a bachelor's degree from Pitt. In 1993, he opened his first insurance agency in Lancaster, PA, and would go on to make that his vocation for the next 25 years. In 2017, Ramsey returned to his first passion and signed on as the oldest rookie at RM Sotheby's, a well-recognized collector car auction house. In 2021, Ramsey was presented with the opportunity to be a founding partner of a new collector car auction house, Broad Arrow Group. "I was familiar with the incredibly talented partners, and with the business lessons I learned from my past, I jumped at the opportunity to bring a new and different auction house to life."



COREY O'CONNOR

Honorary Race Director:

Carrying the Legacy of Bob O'Connor and "The Bob"

This year's Honorary Race Director, Corey O'Connor, is a lifelong Pittsburgher whose story is rooted in Schenley Park—home to both the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix and the beloved Bob O'Connor Golf Course. Named in honor of his late father, Mayor Bob O'Connor, the course has played a central role in Corey's life and continues to serve as a symbol of his family's deep commitment to public service and the city.

Affectionately known as "The Bob," the course was established in the late 1890s and renamed in 2006 following Mayor O'Connor's passing. It remains the city's only public golf course and has been the home of the PVGP since 1983. Today, the course is operated by First Tee - Pittsburgh, serving as a community hub with youth programs, a renovated clubhouse, and indoor simulators.

Born just a year after the PVGP began, Corey worked in the pro shop during high school at nearby Central Catholic. He served ten years on Pittsburgh City Council representing District 5, became Allegheny County Controller in 2022, and in May 2025 won the Demo-



cratic primary for Pittsburgh mayor. The day after the election, Corey held a rain-soaked "Thank You, Pittsburgh" sign—echoing a moment his father shared with the city two decades earlier.

Corey's motorsport roots also run deep. His great uncle, Buddy O'Connor, was a local racing legend who won the Heidelberg Championship in the 1950s. Corey often joined Buddy and his father for trips to the Indianapolis 500–memories that helped shape his love of racing.

Now living in Point Breeze with Katie and their children, Molly and Emmett, Corey brings a spirit of service, tradition, and community to his role as Honorary Race Director. His leadership reflects the enduring values that the O'Connor family has long shared with the people—and places—that define Pittsburgh.



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GUY ALLEN

Lotus in Motion: The Art of Guy Allen Returns to the PVGP






When the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix unveiled its 2018 BMW poster by celebrated artist Guy Allen, the response was so enthusiastic that organizers knew they had to bring him back. Now, Allen lends his creativity once again-this time to honor Lotus, a marque close to his heart and his hometown.

For the 2025 PVGP event, Allen has created a striking tribute featuring three classic Lotus race cars tackling the scenic curves of Schenley Park. At the forefront is a green 1967 Lotus 51A, echoing the spirit of the open-wheel racer depicted in the updated PVGP logo. Alongside it is a 1971 Lotus Elan and cresting a hill in the distance is a red Lotus Seven, framed by a crowd of onlookers. It's a vibrant homage to the legacy of Lotus, ready to be seen in full action during the PVGP race weekend, July 19-20.

With over 25 years in the creative industry, Guy Allen has cultivated a career that defies easy categorization. He is a graphic designer, automotive artist, editorial illustrator, and cartoonist-all rolled into one. His work is instantly recognizable, thanks to a versatile yet distinctive visual style that effortlessly bridges precision and personality.



Allen's portfolio reads like a who's who of the automotive world. From Abarth and Aston Martin to BMW, Lotus, Mazda, and Porsche, he's collaborated with some of the most iconic brands in the industry. His illustrations have graced the pages of Esquire and adorned



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campaigns for FIA, The Petersen Museum, and even Phillips Fine Watches and the Royal Botanic Gardens. His passion for cars goes far beyond the professional. "Childhood obsessions often trace back to a single moment," Allen says. For him, it was witnessing Hannu Mikkola's Audi Quattro tear through a forest during the 1983 RAC Rally. The sound, the speed, the spectacle-it lit a fire that still burns today.



Born in Manchester and raised near the legendary Silverstone Circuit, Allen had a front-row seat to the rise of Ayrton Senna and the pulse of Formula 1. Today, he lives in Kent, not far from Goodwood, where he is a regular at the Festival of Speed-a celebration of motorsport heritage that fits perfectly with Allen's artistic sensibilities.

Trained in graphic design and illustration in London, Allen began his career in identity design before shifting gears into full-time illustration. His goal remains simple, yet profound: "Whether I'm working on an editorial cartoon or a corporate commission, I aim to go beyond just depicting a car. I want to capture its character-the drama of a Countach, the charm of a Fiat 500, or the raw energy of Mikkola's Quattro."

With his new Lotus poster for the PVGP, Guy Allen once again brings machinery to life-not just as vehicles, but as vivid expressions of speed, emotion, and history.





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
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























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

Two New Thrilling Race Tracks Debut in Schenley Park July 19-20

Get ready for an exhilarating evolution of vintage racing in Schenley Park! As the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix enters its 43rd year, we're proud to introduce two dynamic new racecourses that promise to thrill drivers and dazzle spectators alike. With the Panther Hollow Bridge temporarily closed for repairs, the PVGP has crafted an exciting new layout that both honors tradition and opens new possibilities, ushering in a new chapter for our beloved city park races.



Introducing the UPMC Schenley Oval Circuit: A Bold New Take on Our Classic Street Race

Our newly designed 2-mile Schenley Oval circuit weaves through the heart of Schenley Park, merging the fastest sections of our original course with sweeping new turns and challenging elevation changes. Racers will roar along the Boulevard of the Allies, slice through the iconic

hay bale chicane, then veer left just before the Panther Hollow Bridge. The course ascends Overlook Drive, loops around the Schenley Oval and ice rink, and descends onto Greenfield Road–returning for another high-speed lap.

This reimagined layout maintains the tight, technical challenges that make Pittsburgh's race one of the most demanding on the vintage racing calendar—now with a smoother surface and fresh perspective. The start/finish line will be positioned at the crest of Overlook Drive, while the paddock shifts to Prospect Drive. Expect the same adrenaline-pumping corners and 20 marshal stations as in years past.

"We've always dreamed of incorporating the Schenley Oval into our race," says PVGP Competition Director Joe Teplitz. "Now we have. These uphill sweeping esses, with views of Oakland and the Pittsburgh skyline in the background, will be spectacular!"

Watch for spectator zones inside the Oval-this is vintage road racing reborn.





GUIDELINES & AMENITIES

GUEST CODE OF CONDUCT

PARKING & SHUTTLES

Spectator parking is available at Flagstaff Hill, across from Phipps Conservatory, for a \$30 donation per car per day and vehicles or trailers over 25' are \$50/day. Each parking donation includes up to 2 adult admission wristbands for the weekend.

- Free air-conditioned shuttle buses will transport spectators to the golf course and Schenley Oval Paddock.
- Handicap parking and a dedicated handicap-accessible shuttle are available at the base of Flagstaff Hill.

BICYCLES & SPORTS EQUIPMENT


Not allowed on the golf course due to potential damage. Frisbees, footballs, and soccer balls are also prohibited.

SPECTATOR ACCESS: MOTUL PANTHER HOLLOW HILLCLIMB

The 1-mile hillclimb course begins near Phipps Conservatory and ascends the historic West Circuit Drive, ending near the Neill Log House.

Best viewing areas include:

- The golf course, featuring 5 exciting turns.
- Flagstaff Hill view of the starting line and paddock.
- Westinghouse Pond hairpin turn.



SPECTATOR ACCESS: UPMC SCHENLEY OVAL

A new track layout promises thrilling action and enhanced viewing.

Spectators can access the interior of the track by walking:


- 1. Across the Panther Hollow Bridge (pedestrians only).
- 2. Through Anderson Playground, under the bridge tunnel.
- 3. Alongside the Schenley Swimming Pool and crossing Overlook Drive (track crossings allowed only between race sessions).

Once inside the track here are the best viewing areas:

- Vietnam Veterans Pavilion with an area to see cars running in both directions and around the haybale chicane.
- Overlook section of the course–watch racers charge a guarter mile up the hill to the finish line. Spectators can watch from beside the Schenley Ice Skating Rink, featuring a spectator tent with restrooms, seating, and refreshments.

Note: The walk from the Visitors Center to the Vietnam Veterans pavilion is approximately 1/2 mile. No motor vehicle access is allowed inside the track.



The weekend will be filled with shows, racing, track laps, and dinners commemorating the cars and their place of prominence in American motorsports.

The Panoz name is synonymous with quality and performance, with their cars winning some of the most prestigious races in the world, including the Sebring 12-hour endurance race and the 24 Hours of Le Mans GT2 class. Panoz cars have competed in various forms of motorsport, including the American Le Mans Series, United Sportscar Championship, Rolex Sports Car Series, FIA Sportscar Championship, and IMSA GT Championship.

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VINTAGE RACER GROUP

The Vintage Racer Group and PVGP combine efforts at The Historics at Pitt Race to put on one of the country's premier vintage race events. The majority of the competitors are VRG members, and they also represent a large portion of PVGP racers in Schenley Park the following weekend.



The VRG is a non-profit vintage race organization that is well known for its focus on safety and ability to execute efficient race events. VRG's support of the PVGP Historics is in the middle of a race season that begins in April at Virginia International Raceway (VIR), with race weekends (school) at The Jefferson 500 at Summit Point in May, Vintage Motorsports Festival at Thompson Speedway Motorsport Park, The Lime Rock Historic Festival, VRG at Watkins Glen in September, and finishes with VRG's Turkey Bowl at Summit Point in November.



VRG Philosophy:

A vintage sports car can be best appreciated by being driven in an environment for which it was intended. This form of use will encourage the acquisition, restoration, and preservation of the vehicles by current and future generations. VRG's emphasis is on the drivers and their cars where well-prepared cars are coupled with drivers who exhibit safe driving attitude and spirit on and off the track. Events are intended to encourage friendly, safe competition among members with mutual respect for other participants and reverence for the historic nature of the cars. Thorough technical inspection and an objective Drivers Committee to evaluate on-track incidents help all drivers have a safe and enjoyable racing experience. Active member support gives our paddocks and race venues a relaxed and welcoming atmosphere.

VRG was formed in 2004 as an experiment by a group of racers who were looking to expand vehicle eligibility in the vintage racing world along with adopting critical modern safety features. It initially started with one event at New Hampshire Vintage Festival and over the last 21 years has expanded to become one of the largest vintage race organizations in North America.

After racing with VRG for a few events it is guite easy to develop relationships with other racers after going toe-to-toe on the track and then having good conversation afterward in the paddock. The vintage racing spirit is one where racers will quickly offer help to competitors if repair or adjustment is needed on their car so everyone can get back on track. VRG's unofficial motto: Cool Cars, Safe Racing, Great Friends is a testament to 21 years of success.

VRG car eligibility extends through 1989 for most production-based cars, but some classes allow cars through 1993. Historical correctness is key, and the VRG vehicle eligibility and technical inspection teams are thorough but fair in their reviews.

- Pittsburgh Cars 'N' Coffee Exotic Display near the clubhouse.

- Electric Avenue, show sponsored by King Electric, is plugged in just below the clubhouse featuring Teslas and all EVs.



According to Dan Vaughan of ConceptCars.com, "The Mazda Miata was patterned after the Lotus Elan of the 1960s. It was conceived in the United States at Mazda's design headquarters in California and built in Japan. It debuted at the February 1989 Chicago Auto Show, which was an immediate success. It drew thousands of onlookers eager to pay the \$13,800 sticker price."

The West Penn Miata Club is partnering with the PVGP to host this year's Spotlight Show. They are a group of Miata enthusiasts from Western Pennsylvania, Northern West Virginia, and Eastern Ohio that have long supported the PVGP. Look for Miata's at all our Race Week events.

Since 2012, Pittsburgh Cars 'N' Coffee has wowed crowds with over 50 exotic cars featured prominently on the 18th fairway. Founded in 2010, this nonprofit club brings together Western PA's modern performance and supercar enthusiasts for casual Saturday morning meetups. Their friendly yet high-end presence at the PVGP has made them a must-see attraction. Regular gatherings at Generoasta Coffee and Dual Devils Garage reflect their strong community spirit.



Located at The Pittsburgh Golf Club, the Cortile-Italian for "Courtyard of Racing"-celebrates the elegance and engineering of Italian margues including Ferrari, Maserati, Alfa Romeo, Fiat, Lamborghini, and Lancia. The Cortile also hosts 'Wine on Nine,' a VIP gathering near Westinghouse Pond offering spectacular views of the racers as they navigate a tight hairpin turn.

Each year, the Cortile selects a featured margue or model for the Proiettore Macchina. In 2025, Lamborghini takes center stage, sponsored by Lamborghini Philadelphia. The prestigious Cortile Cup is awarded on Saturday, with Sunday showcasing standout Italian cars. This year's event honors the late Wayne Long, a key figure in founding the Cortile Cup.

All Mercedes-Benz enthusiasts are welcome to join and display their vehicles in this premium location on the course.






Our volunteers put the "Grand" in Grand Prix! They are what set us apart from all other vintage races and major events.



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THE OTHER SIDE OF THE FENCE

Ever wonder who all those people are on the other side of the fence at the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix—whether in Schenley Park or out at Pitt Race—and what exactly they're doing?

They're the passionate volunteers who make North America's largest vintage race a reality. From planning to staging and race-day operations, these individuals are essential to every aspect of the event. With the addition of the new Schenley Oval and expanded Hillclimb format, we now have 31 corner stations to staff simultaneously—so yes, we had to buy more flags!

FLAGGERS

The most visible of our volunteers are the Corner Marshals, or flaggers. Positioned at strategic points along the course, they alert drivers to track conditions and hazards using a system of colored flags. Their placement ensures that at least one station is always visible from every part of the course, enabling constant communication with Race Control.

Linda Lips, a corner worker since 1991 and now Chief of Flagging and Communications, is leading the effort. "While our core responsibilities remain the same, the expanded layout brings new dynamics," Linda says. "With more stations to staff, some longtime groups will be split up, especially for the Hillclimb where only one car passes at a time."

RACING FLAGS



GKFFI

The apperance signals a clear course and indicates the immediate start or restart of a race.



YELLOW

- Single Stationary Yellow: Slow down, no passing.
- Single Waving Yellow: Immediate danger, slow down, no passing.
- Double Yellow. Slow down, no passing. The entire course is under Yellow conditions. Prepare for a safety car to enter the course. Racing may commence after passing an incident and the next manned station is in view with no flag displayed.



BLACK

- Closed Flag (furled): Signals "WARNING" when pointed at a participant from the starters stand. Do not continue your action.
- Open Flag (unfurled): Displayed with car number, participant must go immediately to the Black Flag Station in the pits.
- Displayed At All Stations (black flag all): All Competitors Stop Racing. The session has been suspended. Proceed directly to the Pits. Do not take another lap.



BLUE W/YELLOW STRIPE

Check your mirrors. Hold the line, another competitor is following closely or is trying to overtake.



YELLOW W/RED STRIPE

Signals slippery track surface, or debris on the track surface. Exercise caution.



WHITE

Signals that a slow moving Competitor or Emergency Vehicle is on the course. Reduce speed and pass with care.



RFN

Extreme Danger Stop racing. Come to a controlled stop as quickly as possible to the edge of the track, within the driver's line of sight of a flag station. Proceed cautiously to the pits only upon indication from a corner worker.



BLACK W/ORANGE BALL

The "Meatball" flag is shown beside a board with the involved car's number. That car must proceed at a reduced rate to the Black Flag station. Do not take another lap. Something is mechanically wrong with your car.



SAFETY CAR

All Competitors must slow and keep pace with the safety car. No car shall pass the Safety Car unless directed by the Safety Car to do so. The Safety Car slows the field for safety and provides expeditious restarts. The Safety Car will enter the course with lights flashing. Lights off indicates the intention of a restart from start/finish.



CHECKERED

Notifies the race or practice session is finished. Quit racing, cool your car down and return to the pits at the next opportunity.



RACE CONTROL

Located at the start/finish line-this year atop the Schenley Park Overlook near the Ice Skating Rink-Race Control is the operational hub. The communicator is the voice of Race Control, managing radio traffic and coordinating with corner workers. Stewards oversee rules enforcement and track conditions, making crucial decisions in real time.

STARTERS

The Starters wave the green and checkered flags, but they also track laps and race leaders, ensuring the right car sees the checkered flag. They can also signal cars into the pits for issues like mechanical problems or rule violations.



TIMING & SCORING

This team tracks every car's lap time and finishing position. Using a combination of transponders and traditional methods-like stopwatches and lap charts-Timing & Scoring ensures accurate results by class and overall finish.

RADIO OPERATORS

Licensed by the FCC, Amateur Radio operators (or "hams") provide essential communication across the course. Since the PVGP's debut in 1983, hams have helped overcome the communication challenges posed by Schenley Park's terrain. Their reliability remains vital today.



COURSE CREW

The Emergency Services team, affectionately known as the "Coarse Crew," includes trained professionals in medical response, fire fighting, and vehicle recovery. Stationed throughout the course, they respond guickly to incidents, often without disrupting the race..

PADDOCK VOLUNTEERS


The paddock is where fans get up close with the cars and drivers. Volunteers here begin work on Thursday, setting up the paddock, organizing cars, ensuring safety, and directing traffic between the paddock and the grid. The traditional paddock remains on Prospect Drive for the Oval, with a new paddock on Schenley Drive in front of Phipps Conservatory for the Hillclimb.



GRID OFFICIALS

On the grid, officials line up racers by qualifying order, verify inspections and registrations, and conduct lastminute safety checks before cars head to the course.







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

Each year, the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix hosts its Kick-Off Rallye. This year it starts and ends at Dual Devils Garage, winding through the scenic backroads of Washington County. This laid-back but exciting event combines elements of a Monte Carlo and Gimmick rally, making it perfect for beginners. No special experience is needed—just a sense of adventure. It was meant to help kick off Race Week, and the idea of a road rallye was born."

That first event drew 30 cars and marked the start of what would become a cherished tradition.

Over the decades, the Rallye has traveled to various locations, including Ladbrokes, Dingbats, South Park Fairgrounds, the Union Grill, even the Schenley Park

Ice Skating Rink. Participation has grown steadily, at times reaching the event's capacity of 90 vehicles. Paul has continued to lead the Rallye Committee, working alongside many of the same dedicated volunteers for more than two decades.

Each summer since 1983, the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix transforms our city into a rolling celebration of speed, style, and spirit. In 2024, that passion was recognized on the world stage as the PVGP was named a finalist for the Motorsport Event of the Year by the International Historic Motoring Awards-an honor reserved for only the most exceptional automotive celebrations on the planet.

Presented by The Magneto Group and held in London at the prestigious Peninsula Hotel, the IHMA gala recognized elite achievements across the collector car and vintage motorsport world. Among the PVGP's fellow nominees were international icons: the Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion, Velocity Invitational, Silverstone Festival, and the eventual winner-the legendary Goodwood Revival.

The PVGP's Racing Competition Director Joe Teplitz was in London for the awards ceremony stating 'from the response when we were announced as a finalist, it was clear that people in that room were well aware of us. We were filled with pride to be included among the elite events on the list. Our organization should be proud to be recognized globally.'



"This honor belongs to the thousands who make the Grand Prix what it is," said Executive Director Dan Del-Bianco. "Our volunteers, racers, fans, and the City of Pittsburgh have created something the world has taken notice of. We aim to reach even greater heights and one day bring that award home."

HISTORY ON THE MOVE:



A LOOK BACK AT THE RAGTIME RACERS

Last August, the Ragtime Racers—America's premier exhibition of race cars from the 1920s and earlier made a spectacular and memorable debut at the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix in Schenley Park. Bringing a dozen lovingly preserved "Heroic Age" machines to the nation's longest-running vintage street race, the group delighted crowds with the sights, sounds, and smells of pure automotive history.











Each morning and afternoon of race weekend, these brass-era racers tore through the 2.33-mile, 23-turn circuit at speeds topping 80 MPH. Piloted by drivers clad in period overalls, leather helmets,

and goggles, spectators were treated to an authentic glimpse of what racing looked and felt like in the early 20th century. Many cars carried a co-pilot to manage primitive mechanical systems like oil and fuel pumps, turning each exhibition session into a living, moving museum. Enthusiasts even had the rare opportunity to ride along for a donation supporting autism and disability charities.


Paddocked along Schenley Drive with Phipps Conservatory as their backdrop, the Ragtime Racers formed a stunning display of early motorsport heritage, entering and exiting the street circuit near the Panther Hollow Bridge. During the "Evening of Speed" and Garden Party events, fans mingled with drivers and admired the machines up close.


The addition of the Ragtime Racers was a true highlight of the 2024 Grand Prix. For one unforget-
